## COVID RESPONSE

Collected and circulated timely COVID-relief resources to help schools and communities continue to serve students throughout school closures including guidance, funding opportunities, and peer learning related to remote meal distribution, virtual learning, and adjusting farm operations.

## POLICY

Provided research & outreach to support the creation of a MA Farm to School Grant program (S.349)

Held a series of three tours for state legislators to highlight farm to school resilience and innovation. Tours included:

- a local farm and food hub
- an urban school garden site
- an agricultural high school
