




# School Garden Maintenance in the Summer May 1, 2024

# Start from the beginning!

The best place to start arranging for year long support is at the **inception of your gardening ideas.** 

Create your **core team** to include:

- Food Service Director
- Head Custodian
- Master Gardeners
- Diehard Gardeners
- Possible parent involvement
- Neighbors





## Head Custodian

Consult with the Head Custodian:

- For best placement of garden footprint
- Ongoing maintenance of adjacent grounds
- Possible summer support
- Any future garden expansion



#### Master Gardeners

Seek out Master Gardeners:

- For advice on garden placement
- Soil recommendations & amendments
- Produce varieties
- Fertilization
- Pathologies
- Building raised beds



#### **Diehard Gardeners**

- Those people who have prior experience gardening
- Gardening soldiers who will take the lead and share their knowledge
- Help those primarily in the classroom germinating seedlings and subsequent care



#### Parent Involvement

- Often discussed
- Difficult logistics
- Availability & transportation concerns



#### What needs attention during summer months

What maintenance is required:

- Watering
- Weeding
- Harvesting
- Second crops



# What are this gardens watering requirements?

- How long does it take to water manually?
- Is an automatic watering system viable?
- What Staff lives in the immediate proximity?
- What about parents?
- What about Custodians?
- Where is the water source?
- Is the hose and nozzle readily available?
- What is the rain forecast
- When did it last rain?
- Is there a greenhouse involved?



## Fertilizing, Weeding, Harvesting

- Can these 3 functions wait until core group returns?
- Slow-release fertilizers
- Ground cover, for example, cardboard, mulch, hay etc.?





## Other considerations

- Pollinator gardens
- Fruit Trees
- Chickens
